Use of the Covid Minor Works Grant to Purchase Capital Equipment

(Document last updated August 2024)

1. Introduction

Under the Covid Minor Works grant, there was scope to spend monies on items of equipment that may be capital expenditure. This expenditure was to be reflected as fixed assets in the balance sheet of a board's accounts and the grant was to be transferred to Capital & Reserves.

2. Accounting Treatment

The nominal codes to be used to account for the grant received, the expenditure of the grant and any unspent balance are set out below.

2.3 Amortisation of Grants

Amortisation is an accounting technique used to periodically lower the book value of a grant over a set period of time.

The Covid Minor Works grant classified as a capital grant above, should be recognised in the Income and Expenditure Report on a systematic basis. It is recommended that the grant spent should be amortised over 5 years.

The amortisation of the grants would be done at the year-end by the schools external accountant/auditor.

2.4 Depreciation of Covid Minor Works for Capital Equipment Expenditure

Depreciation is an accounting technique used to periodically lower the book value of a capital expense over a set period of time.

The capital expenditure of the Covid Minor Works grant shall be recognised in the Income and Expenditure Report on a systematic basis. It is recommended that the grant spent should be depreciated over 5 years.

The depreciation of the ICT capital expenditure would be done at the year-end by the school's external accountant/auditor.

2.5 Account for the unspent grant balance

The Covid Minor Works grant is a ring-fenced grant and the balance unspent at the yearend must be reconciled and accounted for in nominal code 2169 Covid Minor Works Grant Unspent.
